Norwood Oval continues to kick goals on the national stage



The redeveloped Norwood Oval has received the prestigious AFL's Ken Gannon Community Football Facilities Award.

The multi-million-dollar redeveloped Oval was the only facility in South Australia to receive the Award, which is presented by the AFL's Australian Football Facilities Fund.

To be honoured with the Ken Gannon Community Football Facilities Award is an incredible result and testament to the vision, determination and hard work in what was a huge team effort.

The Council, the Norwood Football Club, State Government and Federal Government contributed, along with awardwinning winemaker and former Number One Ticket holder of the Club, Wolf Blass AM. The redevelopment—which was completed in late 2020 involved the construction of a new two-storey community centre, where the former Baulderstone Stand was located, transforming the venue into one of the premier facilities for football in SA.

The redevelopment also significantly improved facilities for both male and female players and umpires while encouraging increased female participation.

The Ken Gannon Community Football Facilities Awards recognise, on an annual basis, best practise in community football facility development across Australia, along with the people, clubs and other stakeholders driving our best community level projects.

Other topics included how to deal with levels of stress, fashion, nutrition, religion and the law, STEM (science technology, engineering and maths) plus much more!

Multimillion-dollar infrastructure program

The Council can reveal for the first time the incredible time lapse vision of underground infrastructure work being undertaken across our City.

From installing culverts and pollutant traps—the vision of Second and Third Creek shows the extent of work required to ensure residents and businesses are protected from damaging flood waters.

The City's stormwater drainage network is one of many infrastructure assets which is provided and maintained by the Council for the community.

Looking ahead, the Council will be undertaking a range of works to reduce the risk of flooding in the suburbs of St Morris, Trinity Gardens, Maylands and Stepney.

The new infrastructure will reduce surface flood waters during storm events by

capturing stormwater and temporarily storing it in a detention basin in St Morris reserve as well as underground detention tanks within the road network.
